

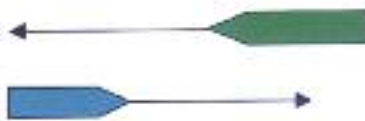
RULES FOR PASSING AND OVERTAKING OTHER VESSELS

PASSING



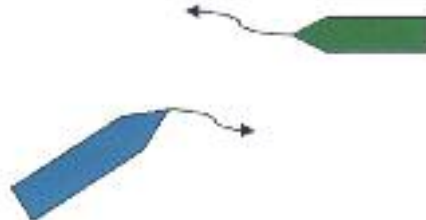
TWO SHORT BLASTS

EMERGENCY RADIO CALL PROCEDURES

Maritime VHF radio is recommended for emergency communication with USCG, NC Wildlife, VA DGIF, county law enforcement and LGWSC equipped monitoring stations

- 1. Make sure VHF radio is on**
- 2. Select Channel 16**
- 3. Press/Hold the transmit button**
- 4. CLEARLY say: Mayday, Mayday, Mayday**
- 5. Also give:**
 - Vessel name/description
 - Position and/or location
 - Nature of emergency
 - Number of persons on board
- 6. Release transmit button**
- 7. Wait for 10 seconds - if no response repeat mayday call**
